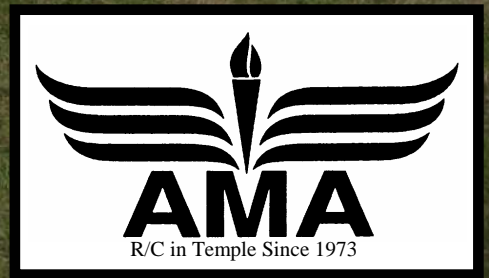

Mr. Stroud died Sunday in a Temple hospital.

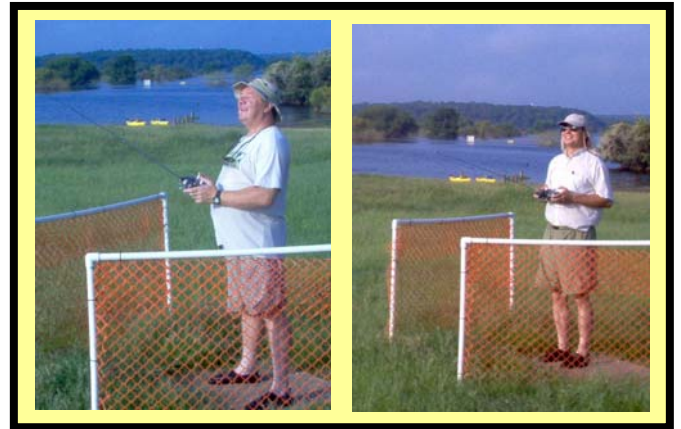
### Biography

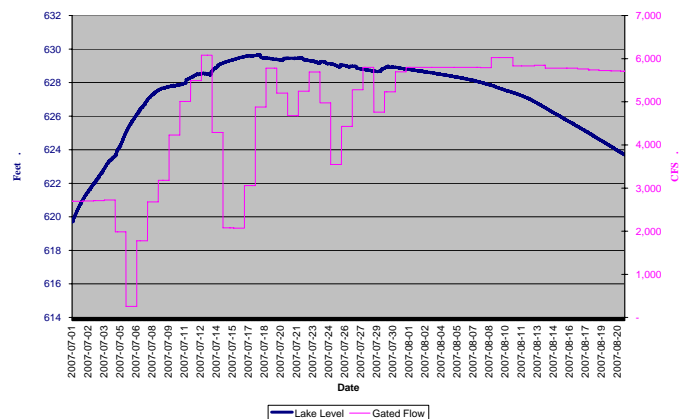
Die Hard Enthusiasts Paddle To Fly
