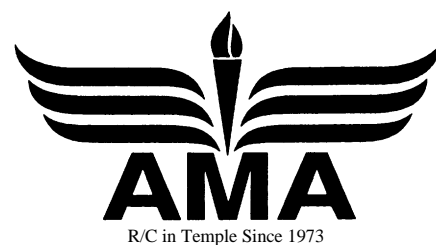

Safety Report

I have a confession to make. There actually is one aspect of pattern competition that I don't like. That is those contests where I find myself flying in conditions where I normally could never consider flying at the home field. The unpleasant flying condition usually has to do with wind. I've never been to a pattern contest where the event was cancelled due to high winds, even at the 2000 NSRCA district championship in Lubbock where the wind velocity got up to 30 mph. The other element that is a challenge is dealing with the sun during the first round on Saturday mornings. That one is actually the toughest to deal with, because just about all pattern airplanes fly OK in windy conditions. So Paul Horan, if you ever get the urge to fly in a 30 mph wind, you can rest assured that the Meridian can handle it.

Another reason the office of Safety Officer at our field has been an easy one for me is that we're all a bunch of fair weather flyers! That's not a bad thing, just a matter of common sense. That threshold where weather conditions are unacceptable is probably different for each of us. For example, I just cannot see my plane well enough to fly safely in the failing light of sunset. But I know that does not seem to be a problem for other club members. As far as windy conditions go, I was one member of a group who showed up at the field about three weeks ago. It turned out that conditions were a lot windier than expected. You know the scenario. We all decided to go home when the birds were walking instead of flying. It's a true story. 2003 Mall Show

Each year our club holds a static display in the mall to show off the planes we've built during the winter, and to let the local community learn about our wonderful club and hobby. This year's show will be held on Saturday, March 29th from 9am - 9pm and Sunday March 30th from noon to 6pm. We will be in the empty store that used to be "Zeno's", which is located between Waldenbooks and the Shoe Department just down from the Food Court (which is located on the east end of the Mall). You can use either the Food Court entrance in the back of the mall (near Foley's) or the main front entrance on the north side (near Casa Ole) to bring your planes in.
